Historical maps consulted show no habitation of the site of the sand mining operation. The 1953 & 1968 aerial photographs were consulted. The aerial images show market gardening taking place east of the operation.

The 1968 topo-cadastral (2930DC) map shows a power line running through the bottom half of the sand mining operation and no habitation

The manager of the operation informed the specialist that the community to the west of surrounding community to west after the borrow pit had commenced with mining of sand. This is reflected in the Google Earth images. In 2002, the operation had begun; the community to the west starts around 2012

3. Detail the work commenced/carried out

The applicant Umsunguli Group (Pty) Ltd, had an approved Mining Permit (KZN 30/5/1/3/2/10339 MP) that was issued on the 19 February 2015 to legally mine Silica Sand (General) from the Umsunguli Borrow Pit and valid for a period of 2 years and was renewed the allotted 3 times in terms of the MPRDA Act (Act No. 28 of 2002; MPRDA). The approved mining permit had expired in February 2020 and the Applicant continued to mine silica sand from the borrow pit. Department of Mineral Resources (DMR) conducted a monitoring and compliance inspection of the site 10 December 2020 and issued a issued a compliance notice in terms of section 31L of the NEMA, 1998. The Applicant has decided to Lodge a S24G application with DMR to rectify the contravention.

Motivation for work (Please motivate fully why work was commenced without approval)

Local businesses are the primary consumers of the mined sand resource. The material mined will be used in the construction industry, which is an important contributor to municipal and provincial development and growth. Apart from supplying good quality material to the construction market, the mine will create job opportunities (skilled and unskilled) benefiting the landowners and the local economy. Consequently, the mine contributes to the development in the area by supplying a vital material for construction which is widely used by local businesses hence the development may be deemed needed and desirable.

Mining is important for economic development, to construct durable, modern structures, employment creation and revenue collection. The proposed site has previously been used for sand mining activities, known to provide good quality silica sand to the local building industry.

Should the mining application be granted for the proposed mining operation, the following benefits could translate:

- Prolonged economic benefits in terms of employment opportunities (due to the extended life of the mine people will be employed for longer);
- Prolonged local economic development benefits through the implementation of the social and labor plan; and

APPLICATIONS FOR DEVELOPMENTS RESTRICTED UNDER SECTION 41 (SECTION 38 OF THE NHRA); these applications must be uploaded to the Sahris system operated by the South African Heritage Resources Agency – go to www.sahra.org.za/sahris. Remember to tick "Amafa" under the KZN Province so that the application lands in the correct inbox on the system. The owner's details must be entered into the "Applicant" field and the professional's details must be entered into the "Consultant" field.

NB: there may be some overlap with regard to the historical and military sites, graves, memorials and sites containing ruins over 100 years of age or other structures. Applicants must use their discretion and follow the process that best suits the nature of the resources and the work carried out. If incorrect the receiving officer will direct the application to the most appropriate heritage officer.

PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS: applications are processed in the order in which they are received, except during the December/January holiday break. Allow 90 days for processing of complex applications as these may be submitted to external reviewers before submission to the Council of the Institute. Lobbying of external reviewers will disqualify the application and the matter will be reported to the relevant professional bodies. Written

responses to applications will be forwarded to applicants by email. Telephonic or e-mails enquiries will not generally be responded to.
