

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ATTEMPTED RELOCATION OF ONE GRAVE FROM THE REMAINDER OF PORTION 62 OF THE FARM WATERVAL 5 IR TO WATERVAL MUNICIPAL CEMETERY

This report is submitted in fulfilment of the requirements of:

- ❑ The **South African Heritage Resources Agency**, issued under Section 36(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act no. 25 of 1999 to Stephany van der Walt.
- ❑ The agreement between *PGS Heritage (Pty) Ltd* and LEAP Landscape Architects and Environmental Planners for the completion of *the Waterval Grave Relocation Project*.

PGS Heritage (Pty) Ltd was contracted by LEAP Landscape Architects and Environmental Planners to identify and relocate, by means of an archaeological excavation, one grave that was located on the remainder of portion 62 of the farm Waterval 5 IR, Midrand, Gauteng Province.

This report documents the excavation of the grave (as required by SAHRA in terms of section 36 of the National Heritage Resources Act, 25 Of 1999). Subsequent information revealed that the grave was desecrated (apparently, the human remains were illegally exhumed) in late 1993.

1 INTRODUCTION

PGS Heritage (Pty) Ltd has been appointed by LEAP Landscape Architects and Environmental Planners to relocate the human remains that will be adversely affected by the housing development planned for this portion of land. The grave is that of Mr William Morris, who died age 48 on 23 April 1887. In order to mitigate any damage and loss of the headstone and contents of the grave, it was proposed that the grave and its contents be relocated to the closest municipal cemetery.

The excavation of the grave on Tuesday, 6 December 2016, subsequently revealed no evidence of a grave. Therefore, no human remains were recovered for relocation and the grave that was pre-booked at the Waterval municipal cemetery was cancelled.

2 LOCATION

The grave is an informal grave located on the grounds of the Waterfall Polo Club on Maxwell Drive, Waterfall, Midrand, Gauteng, on part of the Remainder of Portion 62 of the Farm Waterval 5 IR. The GPS Coordinates for the site is: Latitude -26.024399°, Longitude 28.084916° (APPENDIX A) and it forms part of the new Waterval City Development.

3 STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

A broader public process was undertaken by placing site notices at the grave and at the entrance to the property on 13 June 2016 (APPENDIX B). Newspaper notices were also placed in two local newspapers, *The Citizen* on 13 and 20 July, *The Midrand Observer* on 8 July and 15 July 2016 (APPENDIX C). From this, many interested parties from the local community registered with PGS and were kept informed of the process planned for the grave relocation (APPENDIX D). In the correspondence with the local community it was explained that the relocation of the Morris grave would continue once all the required permits were obtained. The community were invited to send PGS their objections in writing and explain why they objected to the relocation of the Morris grave by 19 September 2016. As no objections were received, the permitting process continued.

4 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

As part of the Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) research was done to gain a better understanding on the context of this grave (Angel, 2016). The original name of the farm was Waterval No 34, which was established in 1850. The farm, now known as Waterval 5 IR, is also referred to as “Mia’s Farm”

in some historical documents (De Jong, 2006; National Cultural History Museum, 1998). The grave of Mr William Morris is located on the farm but was disturbed from its original location, as will be further explained.

Mr William Morris was born in Hertfordshire, England to John and Mary Morris. He worked as a carpenter but it is unclear when he immigrated to South Africa. Mr Morris died on 23rd April, 1887 without any children and left no will and testament (APPENDIX E)(TAB, 1887). It is unclear whether Mr William Morris was married to Mrs Emily Morris (previously Pymont) or not. As the death certificate states that he was unmarried but said that he died on “Waterval farm outside Pretoria by Emily Pymont”. Letter from solicitors, pertaining to his will and testament state the Ms Emily Pymont is his widow (De Jong, 2006; TAB, 1887).

During 1890, Several letters were written from Ingle Cooper and Holmes Solicitors in London, who represented the Mother and sisters of the late Mr W. Morris. Mr W. Morris was understood to have left “real and personal estate to a considerable amount” which the family were stating claim to (APPENDIX G)(TAB, 1887).

In 1888 Miss Pymont had the land properly surveyed and the Surveyor-General Johann Rissik approved the diagram in June 1888, which was then signed off by President Paul Kruger in January 1889 (De Jong, 2006). After Mr Morris’ death, Mrs Morris reverted back to her maiden name and sought the assistance of the Weeskamer in 1892 to sort out the estate of her late husband (TAB, 1887). The Weeskamer Z.A. Republiek (Orphan Chamber), was a government body that administered that estates of orphans and partial orphans (APPENDIX F)(TAB, 1887). Miss Pymont then proceeded to sell portions of the farm (De Jong, 2006).

Miss Pymont later remarried and became Emily McDonald who had an adoptive daughter Nelly Morris (TAB, 1902). There is speculation that Nelly Morris is the daughter of William and Emily Morris. Emily died on 2 December 1902 and her will dated 18 April 1900 made everything out to her daughter, Nelly Morris. It included land and a considerable amount of 10,884.78 pounds.

Further in-depth research was done after the exhumation revealed no evidence of a grave. The excavation revealed that the ‘grave’ contained no human remains. It was hypothesised, on the day of the attempted exhumation that the headstone might be a memorial instead of a headstone. The Johannesburg City Parks Municipality were subsequently contacted to identify any graveyards in the area that were active in 1887. A historical grave register was shared with PGS and through this additional archival documents were uncovered detailing that the grave existed on the farm in good

condition for 106 years, until sadly on 22 December 1993 it was discovered that the grave had been desecrated by grave robbers (APPENDIX H) (Unknown, 1994). At this stage, it is not known if the headstone was replaced in the same position where it was originally located, or if it was moved to a new location after the contents of the grave has been desecrated.

All attempts to contact any family connections to Mr Morris have been futile. No affected families have been identified thus far. Legal Compliance

In order to fully comply with legislation, we applied and were granted permits and authorisation from the following entities:

- In terms of Removal of Graves and Dead Bodies Ordinance (Ord. 7 of 1925), we applied to the delegated Provincial MEC at the Gauteng Department of Cooperative Government Traditional Affairs, who is the Member of the Executive Council responsible for local government in the Province.
- In Gauteng the Provincial Department of Health is the relevant sphere of government identified in the Regulations Relating to the Management of Human Remains (Act 61 of 2003 - R363, 2013).
- In terms of the Regulations Relating to the Management of Human Remains (Act 61 of 2003 - R363, 2013), we gave sufficient notice, 7 days prior to exhumation, to the Local Municipality which has jurisdiction to ensure the supervision of an Environmental Health Practitioner.
- In terms of the Regulations Relating to the Management of Human Remains (Act 61 of 2003 - R363, 2013), we notified the local SAPS and arranged for a member of SAPS to be present during the exhumation.
- In terms of the National Heritage Resources Act (NHRA, Act 25 of 1999) as well as the NHRA Regulations of 2000 (Act 25 of 1999 - R548, 2000), graves in a burial ground not administered by a local authority, or graves and mortal remains of victims of conflict and, or graves older than 60 years as well as all graves older than 100 years, are also subject to the stipulations of the NHRA.

4.1 LEGAL COMPLIANCE SUMMARY

As stated, in order to comply with the above regulations, all local laws and by-laws regarding cemeteries were also adhered to.

- A registered funeral undertaker, Martin Funeral Services Randburg, was to conduct the handling and reburial of the exhumed remains as required by the relevant regulations (APPENDIX H).
- The station commander of the Midrand, SAPS was informed of the permitting process (APPENDIX J) and the date of exhumation seven (7) days before the exhumation took place.
- Permission was granted by the land owner in terms of the NHRA and the Health Act 61, R363. Witwatersrand Estates Limited was informed of the relocation of grave and had no objections (APPENDIX K).

Permissions to exhume and re-bury the human remains and associated grave dressings and cultural remains were obtained from the following responsible authorities.

- The Gauteng Health Department (APPENDIX L).
- The Department of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs (CoGTA Gauteng) (APPENDIX M).
- South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA) as the grave is older than 100 years and in a burial ground not administered by a local authority (APPENDIX N).
- The Johannesburg City Parks and Zoo was contacted and a booking at the Waterval Municipal Cemetery was made (APPENDIX O).

5 METHODOLOGY

The methods employed during exhumation aimed to recover all the remains, to minimise damage to the remains and to preserve and respect the dignity of the buried individual.

The excavation and exhumation methods usually employed accomplish the *in situ* exposure of the burial and associated artefacts (Nienaber and Steyn, 1999). However, in this case no remains were found; therefore, no *in situ* exposure of the remains could be achieved. Various methods for the excavation of graves have been proposed by different authors (Hester, 1975; Joukowsky, 1980; Krogman and Iscan, 1986; Morse, 1978) and all stress the need for adequate workspace around the exposed remains and a systematic approach to the removal of individual bones.

The PGS team arrived onsite at 08h00 and was joined on site by Mrs Lilith Wynne, who was listed as an interested member of the community. Mrs Wynne is a retired archaeologist, and a trusted colleague within the profession. She was present for the duration of the excavation and was included in discussions about possibly curating the headstone and the general history of the area. The digging of the grave was conducted by PGS trained and qualified Heritage Practitioners.

Description of the grave:

A large stone headstone was observed to the eastern extent of a small enclosure. The enclosure boundary was marked by trees that had been planted in an oval (Figure 1 and Figure 2). The grave was orientated east west, with the inscription facing east (Figure 2 and Figure 3).

The headstone bore the inscription, *“To the memory of William Morris, who dies 23rd April 1887, Aged 48 years (Figure 4).”*

The headstone was removed with the assistance of the TLB as it was too heavy to remove by hand (Figure 7). It was noted as inconsistent that the inscription on the headstone was facing east but the enclosure within the trees was to the south. Nevertheless, a trench was dug to the western side of the grave as the trees indicated this to be the location and extent of the grave. The trench was dug to a depth of 1.5m and no evidence of a burial pit or any cultural remains were found (Figure 6). A further test trench was dug on the eastern side of the headstone outside the tree enclosure, but this also yielded sterile soil with now evidence of a grave. The headstone was collected the following day by Martins Funeral as a pickup truck was required for the transport. The headstone will be stored with the undertaker until formal arrangements can be made with a local museum to curate the headstone.

Mrs Wynne made arrangements with the landscape architects from the neighbouring retirement village (Waterfall Hills Mature Lifestyle Estate), to relocate the trees where they will be incorporated into their gardens.

6 CONCLUSION

1. No evidence of a grave was found at the location marked by the headstone of late Mr. William Morris.
2. Information received from the City of Johannesburg after the excavation indicated that the original grave has been desecrated and that at least some and possibly all the human remains have been removed from the grave in 1993.
3. It was concluded that, as no evidence of a grave could be found at current location of the headstone, it could have been placed within the trees during the leveling of the land for the polo fields.
4. The headstone was placed in storage until proper arrangements can be made for it to be curated at a local museum.

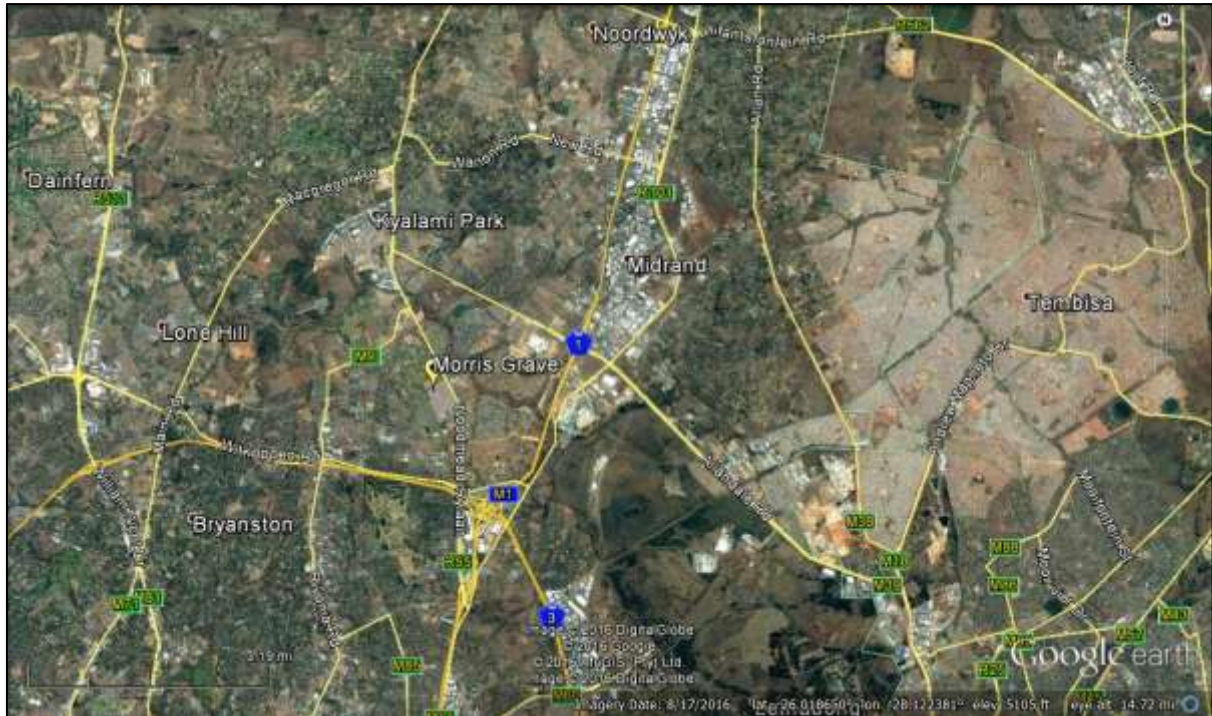


Figure 8: Location of the Morris grave in relation to the Waterval area in Midrand.

Good Day,

As part of the development of the proposed new Waterfall housing estate, the grave of the late Mr William Morris (see attached picture) will be affected. In response to the notices that were placed at the site you listed yourself as an interested and affected party.

In order to mitigate any damage and loss of the headstone and contents of the grave, it is proposed that the grave and its contents be relocated to the closest municipal cemetery or to a cemetery of the next-of-kin's choosing.

As part of the permit application process background/archive research was done to try to understand the context of this grave. In summary, the original name of the farm was Waterval No 34 and was established in 1850. The farm, now known as Waterval 51R, is also referred to as "Mia's Farm" in some historical documents^{1, 2}. Mr William Morris, the deceased, was married to Mrs Emily Morris who was previously Miss E. Prymont^{1, 3}. All attempts to contact any family connections to Mr Morris have been futile. This public participation process will be explained and included in all permit applications.

In order to fully comply with legislation we are also seeking the permission of the following entities;

- In terms of Removal of Graves and Dead Bodies Ordinance (Ordinance 7 of 1925), an application will be made to the delegated Provincial MEC who is also the authorised sphere of government identified in the regulations Relating to the Management of Human Remains (No R 363 of 22 May 2013) of the National Health Act (No 61 of 2003).
- In terms of the Regulations Relating to the Management of Human Remains (No R 363 of 22 May 2013) of the National Health Act (No 61 of 2003), notice will be given 7 days prior to exhumation, to the Municipality (Local or District) that has jurisdiction to ensure the supervision of the relocation process by an Environmental Health Practitioner.

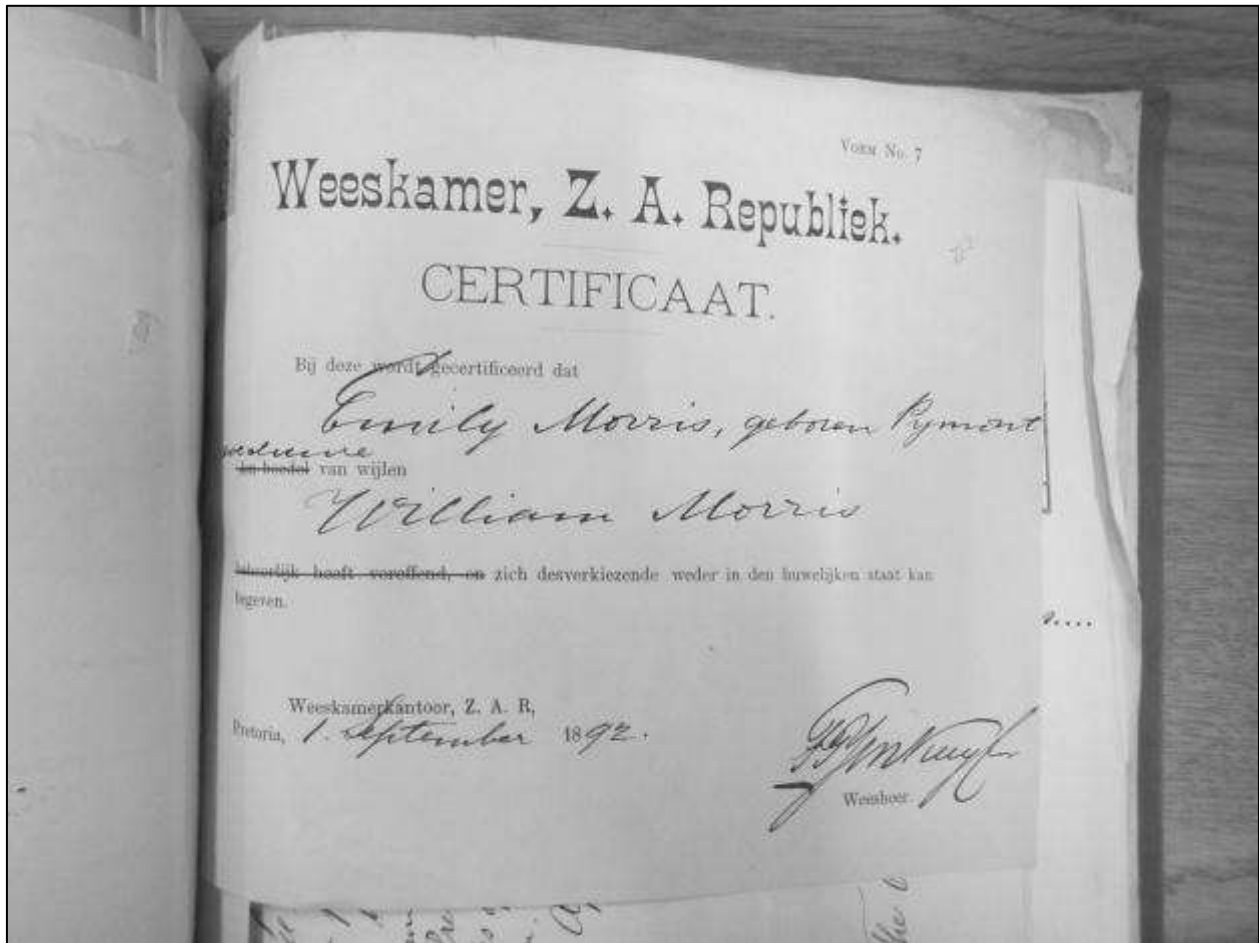

At the date of the death of Mr Morris both his Father & Mother were living but his Father has since died. The deceased had also 3 Sisters - 2 of whom are living & one is dead leaving issue.

We understand that according to the law of Pretoria a Schedule of the deceased's real & personal property would be filed in the Orphan-Home & we shall be obliged if you will have a copy made of such Schedule & send it to us & advise us who is entitled to the deceased's property & in what proportion & what steps they must take to enforce their rights & in particular whether it is necessary to give a Power of Attorney & if so who shall

give the same & to whom it is
given - We will of course defray any
charges you may incur - Our firm is

Hundred-year-old grave desecrated

THE desecration of a grave, prompted a horrified Gloria Hopgood to telephone the Sandton Chronicle in the hopes of finding a relative of the deceased.

"For 30 years I have been horse riding on Mia's Farm, which is between Megawatt Park and Sunninghill," reported Gloria. "In recent years Alastair Kernaghan, a South African Police reservist, has accompanied me. One of our favourite rides takes us past the grave of William Morris who died on April 23 1887, aged 48 years. We have often stopped and read the epitaph. On December 22, to our horror, Alastair and I found the tombstone had been pushed over and the grave dug out."

Gloria is confused about the motive for the desecration.

"Is it mutli-related, or perhaps Satanic?" she asked. "This grave has, for the past 30 years, been in perfect condition and I cannot accept that the desecration was the work of hooligans."
