INTRODUCTION

Umlando was contracted to undertake an archaeological survey of Erf 935 Brickfield, by Buk'Indalo Conservancy cc, on behalf of RZT Zelphy 4781 (Pty) Ltd. The area is marked for housing development, and is located in Durban.

The area of development consists of heavily vegetated and steep sloping ground. The vegetation consists of large Blue Gum trees and dense undergrowth. Archaeological visibility would be poor. Figure 1 is a locality map.

RESULTS

No archaeological sites were observed during the survey. This is expected as the slope of the ground is too steep for human habitation. The land has also appears to have been partially disturbed in the past.
