This is needed in order to supply a more reliable electricity supply. The peak of the building will be 6.7m high, the tubular busbars 6.1m and the height of the earth wire colums 10.7m.			
A preferred site has been earmarked for the substation, with two alternatives in the same vicinity. Depending on which of these are decided upon, the length of the power line will vary between 160 m and 1.3 km.

In fact, all three are quite disturbed by recent farming and forestry practices and therefore chances of finding archaeological and historical material is very unlikely. No archaeological reports were found for the surrounding area. No archaeological sites are known from the George-Knysna area (see Mitchell 2002; Robertshaw 1990; Huffmann 2007. Iron Age people never roamed this far south, but Stone Age sites have been discovered along the coast and in the mountains of the surrounding areas. One may therefore expect to find the odd stone tool below ground level. During Colonial times, people moved into the southern Cape since the 1700's and buildings and associated structures, mostly linked to the missionaries and farming communities may be found.
