SOMERSET HOSPITAL PRECINCT ARCHAEOLOGICAL SENSITIVITY IN TERMS OF REVISED PRECINCT PLAN 2007

Extensive archaeological testing of the site has been carried out during 2006. The findings of this study indicate that bed rock is close to surface, areas where there was any soil depth was sterile of generally protected archaeology. The chances of any impacts taking place are considered to be very low. Due to the intensive physical testing of the site, our confidence in this finding is considered to be high.
