1 INTRODUCTION

PGS Heritage was appointed by Sibanye-Stillwater Western Platinum Limited (WPL), to affect the relocation of 10 graves situated in the K3 Return Dam on the Farm Rooikoppies 297 JQ, near Marikana, North-West Province.

The exhumation and relocation of the graves took place on 25 April 2023. Doves Funerals (Rustenburg) conducted the reburial on the next day, in the presence of the NoK.

2 STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

The project was originally handled by the University of Pretoria (their BA3G unit) and Doves (who was involved throughout). PGS Heritage was initially appointed to handle the project's permit applications and exhumation phases and was subsequently appointed to take over the project management and stakeholder engagement. The original stakeholder engagement process, aimed to identify the correct closest next-of-kin of the graves, commenced on 25 October 2015. The next-of-kin (NoK) has been engaged and has at the time given written consent for the relocation. Since various factors delayed the process (the main problem being the dam being inundated for large parts of the year), the process started anew in 2020.

According to Sibanye-Stillwater Western Platinum (WPL) this is the stakeholder engagement process that was followed with the associated next-of-kin for the graves:

- Respective families raised concerned about the potential impact of mining operations into the cultural heritage sites, particularly graves;
- Various family engagements sessions, both bilateral and collective engagements took place with families requesting relocations of the affected and setting out their expectations for the grave relocation to take place;
- Further family engagements took place to clarify the reasons for the delays in the relocations of graves;
- Sibanye-Stillwater objectively considered the demands/expectations by the respective families and made commitments to pay the wake fee and cover the funeral expenses including other related expenses;
- The agreement on the wake fee and other related expenses resulting in the planning for grave relocation and subsequently the graves relocation executed in collaboration with respective families.

Additional to the very prolonged stakeholder engagement process, the following activities were also undertaken:

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- Bilingual site notices (English and Setswana) announcing the intention to relocate the graves were erected at the burial ground and mine entrance on 16 September 2015.
- Bilingual newspaper notices (English and Setswana) announcing the intention to relocate the graves were published in the Daily Sun on 14 June 2016, and the Platinum Weekly on 13 May 2016.

It must be noted that representatives of Sibanye-Stillwater Western Platinum Limited (WPL) were in continuous contact with the NoK regarding the relocation process. Copies of the site-and newspaper notices, as well as the family consent letters and affidavits, can be made available by PGS Heritage upon request.

3 LEGAL COMPLIANCE

The process of exhumation and re-interment of human remains in the North-West Province is governed by the National Heritage Resources Act (NHRA) as required by Section 36 of Act 25 of 1999, the relevant Municipal laws and by-laws, and Regulation 363 promulgated under the National Health Act (Act 61 of 2003) as the guidelines for the handling of human remains. The graves and mortal remains of victims of conflict and graves older than 60 years or graves situated in a burial ground not administered by a local authority, as well as all graves older than 100 years, are subject to the stipulations of both the Heritage and Health Acts. The relocation of all graves older than 60 years is subject to the National Health Act. To comply with the relevant legislation, permissions to exhume and reinter remains and associated cultural material from the graves were obtained from the following responsible authorities:

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4 METHODOLOGY

The methods employed during exhumation aimed to recover all the remains, minimise damage to the remains, to record the three-dimensional context of the remains and preserve and respect the dignity of the buried individuals.

4.1 Locating Graves

In archaeological investigations, surface features and anomalies, such as grave markers (grave dressing and headstones) are used to detect the location of known graves (Watson *et al.*, 2020). In detecting the location of clandestine graves, where the burial does not contain any surface markers, or in cases where families cannot remember the location of their graves, changes in soil and vegetation conditions are used as markers of possible burials (Watson *et al.*, 2020). In cases where human remains did not preserve the buried grave goods, pieces of the coffin and often only the burial pit itself are used as cultural indicators of the burial (Finnegan *et al.*, 2011).

With the influence of colonial settlers and Christianity, graves were buried in an extended supine position with the head to the west and the feet to the east (Rose, 1922). Children were typically buried within the courtyard, while infants were buried under the house (Huffman, 2010). Within this period, it was typical for individuals to be buried in horizontal positions (L'abbe *et al.*, 2006). Often in these types of burials, the deceased was placed in a form of a coffin.

4.2 Vegetation

Burials can be detected from vegetation anomalies within a landscape/site, and include the composition, type, size, and colour of the vegetation found (Watson *et al.*, 2020). This is mostly a result of the vegetation growing at a site that has been disturbed, for the digging of a burial pit (Watson *et al.*, 2020). Specific species of grasses may also grow, in response to the decomposition of the remains and are usually different to the surrounding undisturbed soil and vegetation (Watson *et al.*, 2020). This is the result of nutrients that are released into the soil by the decomposing body, as well as the influence of water retention due to the presence of plastic wrappings in the coffin (Wright *et al.*, 2005, Watson *et al.*, 2020). In some cases, because the lowering subsoil (which might have a higher salt content) is mixed with the surface soil, the growth of weeds instead of the seasonal vegetation is encouraged (Wright *et al.*, 2005). All these changes within the vegetation are indicative of subsurface disturbances and possibly related to a body being buried.

4.3 Soil

Soil disturbances and anomalies related to burials are a result of the process of digging and backfilling after the remains have been placed in the pit of a grave (Watson et al., 2020). During the process of

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excavating, the different soil deposits mix, and this results in an excess amount of soil that is left on the surface (also called overburden) (Watson *et al.*, 2020). Since the overburden consists of the mixing of the various soil deposits excavated from the site, it has a different colour and texture from the natural soil horizons typically found in undisturbed contexts on site (Watson *et al.*, 2020). Furthermore, since the soil was placed to the sides of the pit as it was dug, the overburdened soil could be spread around the general location of the burial pit (Wright *et al.*, 2005). As the body decomposes in the grave, there is a decrease in the organic material found in the burial pit, which leads to cracking and depressions which can be observed on the surface soil of the burial pit (Watson *et al.*, 2020). It should be noted that the process of decomposition of skeletal remains is influenced by a variety of factors including whether the remains were buried in a coffin or wrapped in a cloth, moisture, and water content of the soil, as well as the acidity of the soil (Watson *et al.*, 2020).

4.4 The Burial Pit

During the manual excavation of burial pits with a trowel and brush, it is possible to follow the original grave cut. The edges of the burial pit are usually distinguished from the surrounding undisturbed soil through the differences found in the colour and texture of the deposit (Wright *et al.*, 2005). The differences are visible because the digging brings up the finer subsoil which is coloured differently (has a higher mineral content) and is distinguishable from the darker topsoil (which contains humus) (Wright *et al.*, 2005). Often the mixed soil also contains smaller rocks and stones. These inclusions assist in indicating the break in the natural continuity of the site stratigraphy (Wright *et al.*, 2005). In finding the bottom of the burial pit, field excavators also rely on the differences in soil texture. Often the pick, shovel and tooth marks of the tools used to open the original pit are visible and can be followed to determine the extent and size of the pit (Wright *et al.*, 2005).

4.5 Recovery of the remains

The excavation methods employed aimed to accomplish the *in-situ* exposure of the burials and any associated artefacts (Nienaber and Steyn, 1999). The focus was on accurate and complete documentation (Nienaber, 1997). Various methods for the excavation of graves have been proposed by different authors (Hester, 1975; Joukowsky, 1980; Krogman and Iscan, 1986; Morse, 1978) and all stress the need for adequate workspace around the exposed remains and a systematic approach to the removal of individual bones. Standard forensic archaeological techniques (Steyn *et al.*, 2000) were employed throughout the excavation of the graves to ensure the methodical retrieval of all disturbed and undisturbed human skeletal remains and associated artefacts. The area was carefully excavated and documented *in situ* using photography and field notes. After documentation, the *in situ* remains were excavated. The loose soil at the bottom of the grave pit was removed and sieved to recover any small pieces of skeletal remains or associated artefacts. The excavated area was cleaned using trowels and brushes. The remains were carefully removed and placed in body bags and coffins for reburial.

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The archaeological method, including extensive test trenching to prevent damage to the remains, was employed. This approach is mainly like that of forensic archaeology, where buried body cases are concerned. The approach was adapted for each situation since graves vary in shape, size, depth and content (Nienaber and Steyn, 1999). In this case, the extent of the burial pit was ascertained through excavation and observation of differences in the matrix. After the indications of the presence and characteristics of the burial pit had been documented, the in-fill was excavated to identify any human remains still visible. Removal of the matrix of the burial pit was accomplished through the test-trench approach, whereby a narrow trench (25-30 cm wide) is excavated with a trowel to a depth of between 15 and 20 cm in the lower third of the burial pit (in this instance the lower third usually constituted the eastern side of the grave). As no indications of the presence of human remains were observed in the test trench, the remaining in-fill matrix, down to the depth of the test trench, was removed with a shovel.

4.6 Presence of human remains

In all the cases where human remains were encountered, the following methodology was followed:

As soon as human remains were encountered, care was taken to leave as much of the skeleton as possible covered, to protect the remains from damage by excavation and to preserve the integrity of the context of the skeletal elements and possible associated cultural material. The extent and characteristics of the burial pit were then documented.

The excavations continued with the aim of ascertaining the extent of the skeletal remains and the location of the different skeletal elements, after which the remains were uncovered, starting from the middle, and working outwards. This method again ensured the minimum disturbance of the remains and associated cultural materials. As soon as the skeleton was uncovered, it was documented *in situ* and removed. The human remains were removed and immediately placed directly into a body bag and then placed into the coffin and handed to the undertaker for reburial.

4.7 Ground Penetrating Radar

Broadly speaking, two types of reflections are visible for interpretation on a radargram: point origin reflections (visible as a hyperbola) and the reflection of dielectric boundaries in the soil (visible as planar reflections). There are of course other reflections and noise such as radio wave interference and airwaves from surrounding and overhead structures that one must be cognisant of during the collecting and post-processing of data.

When searching for burials, it rarely, if ever, happens that the GPR picks up a reflection of the human remains (in archaeology, these normally consist only of skeletal material, if any). The dielectric value of the skeletonised remains is normally too close to that of the soil and therefore no reflection is visible. What one would normally look for are therefore evidence of the burial pit itself or remnants of the coffin, especially if it contains some sort of metal. When a grave is dug through well-defined sub-

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surface strata, the break in stratigraphy may be visible on the radargram, provided that the dielectric value of the strata is significantly different from that of the surrounding soil.




Figure 1 - Time/depth slice at 0.2m below the surface showing the individual burials. The blue and purple features are areas of high amplitude and in this case, shows the edges of the individual burial pits. The orientation of this image is the same as the site layout in Figure 3.




Figure 2 - Time/depth slice at 0.95m below the surface showing the individual burials. The blue and purple features are areas of high amplitude and in this case, shows the edges of the individual burial pit, albeit not as clearly as at 0.2m. The orientation of this image is the same as the site layout in Figure 3.

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


Figure 3 - Site Layout Map of the K3 grave site.

5 RESULTS OF THE EXHUMATIONS AND RELOCATIONS

5.1 Location of the informal burial ground:

GPS Coordinates:

• -25.686806° and 27.448750°

5.2 Property description:

• The farm Rooikoppies 297 JQ, near Marikana, in the North-West Province.

On the day of the exhumation, many family members along with the three nominated NoK were on site, as well as members of the relevant authorities including SAPS Marikana and the Bojanala District Municipality. Representatives from Sibanye-Stillwater arranged and also attended the proceedings. Before the exhumations commenced, the family were given a chance to conduct prayers and rituals. A priest was on site, at the request of the family, and he delivered a brief sermon and prayer.

Each grave's surface features were documented (measured, photographed and notes made of the general condition). Once this was done for all ten graves, the PGS team removed the surface dressings

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and levelled the area. Thereafter another member from PGS scanned the area using a GPR.

Once the above was completed, the exhumations commenced. Three graves (K3/02, K3/04 and K3/07) that were earmarked for reburial at the Ramotse Cemetery in Hammanskraal and the one grave (K3/09) for the Tlhatlaganyane Village Cemetery, were exhumed first as they needed to be re-buried the next day before 10am.

The graves were excavated by hand. However, this proved very difficult and time-consuming due to the condition of the soil (clay, which when dry, is almost impossible to dig by hand). At the request of the NoK an arrangement was made with the assistance of the Sibanye-Stillwater officials to hire a TLB to assist with the exhumation of the remaining graves.

When the TLB arrived on site, the soil was carefully removed layer by layer from the grave pit so as not to damage the actual remains. The TLB operator was guided by a member from PGS who continuously monitored the excavation of the grave. When enough soil was removed to expose the top of the grave, the TLB was stopped and members of the PGS team continued to dig by hand until the remains were completely exposed. Only one (K3/04) of the ten graves was exhumed manually in its entirety. The remains were documented, exhumed, and placed in a new coffin for reburial. Thereafter the graves were carefully backfilled, and the site levelled. This all took place with the NoK in attendance. All the graves were exhumed on the 25th of April 2023. The remains were reburied the next day with the NoK present.

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


Figure 9 – Exhumations starting at the K3 grave site, with the family in the background under the tent.

It is important to note that the overall preservation of the excavated human remains in the burial grounds was 75 - 100% and of (quality) preservation. As the grave was old the sex of the deceased could not be determined. The criteria used to determine the preservation of the remains are as follows (Manifold 2015):

- 0%: No remains visible but evidence of a grave pit
- 0 25%: Approx. bone fragments and teeth
- 25 50%: Approx. fragmented long bones
- 50 75%: Approx. smaller long bones missing
- 75 100%: Approx. extremities and ribs missing
- 100%: mostly intact and complete skeleton

After the reburial of the remains in the Marikana Municipal Cemetery as well as the Ramotse Traditional Cemetery and the Tlhatlaganyane Village Cemetery as requested by the NoK, each new grave was marked with a grave marker containing the name of the deceased (if available) and the old grave number (where applicable), for reference purposes. Details of the individual graves and their relocations are contained in the individual grave descriptions below.

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6 CONCLUSION

During the relocation process, ten (10) graves were exhumed on the 25th of April 2023 from the basin of the K3 Return Dam and reburied on the 26th of April 2023. The excavations resulted in the remains of six adults, one sub-adult and three infants being identified and relocated. The graves were re-interred in the Marikana, Ramotse and Tlhatlaganyane cemeteries respectively on the day after the exhumation. The reburials were handled by Doves Funerals (Rustenburg) in the presence of the NoK.




Figure 18 - Google Earth locality map of the graves within the wider area.

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


Figure 19 - Google Earth locality map of the informal burial ground where the graves are located.





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
