

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## INTRODUCTION

The National Monuments Council is presently compiling suveys of conservation - worthy properties in South Africa in order to assist local authorities in formulating conservation policies for their towns.

The surveys also act as a means by which certain protective legislation can be applied to such properties in terms of the National Monuments Act (No. 28 of 1969).

In terms of the Act the NMC may declare national monuments, place buildings on its register of conservation - worthy properties or designate conservation areas.

The purpose of this survey is to act as a guide for proposed conservation measures for individual buildings, or groupings of buildings, which have been identified as worthy of consevation; and to establish consultation with the municipality, and the owners of relevant properties in order to effectively manage our cultural heritage.

## 1. Classification of Properties

Two categories of individual properties are identified:

Firstly, properties which are considered to be of outstanding historical, cultural and/or architectural and contextual merit are given are proposed for investigation for possible declaration as national monuments. These properties are given the rating as NAT. MONUMENT in the field on the attached computer printouts named NMCCAT.

Secondly, properties of intrinsic architectural, cultural and/ or aesthetic merit and which are of local importance are proposed for the National Register - a register of all properties in South Africa for which consevation planning and management are deemed necessary. Such properties are given the rating REGISTER in the above - mentioned field.

Where strong groupings of conservation - worthy properties are identified, conservation areas are proposed. Factors to consider here are the character of infill architecture in terms of scale, style and location as well as the general environment in which the properties are situated. Where relevant, the boundaries of such areas are indicated on the plan annexed to the survey.

One of the first steps the NMC proposes in planning for conservation is the placement of properties on the National Register. This step establishes formal consultation between the the NMC, the local authority and the property owners. It also forms the basis for possible further conservation measures; namely research into the possible declaration of national monuments and the designation of conservation areas.

2. How to Locate a Property on the Survey

Each computer entry has a survey number which is provided in the field CATALOGUE (eg. Block 1, Building 3). This number corresponds with the photograph number and the number of the property on the plan. In this way the property description, location and appearance are combined.
