First phase archaeological and cultural heritage assessment of the proposed Vididex development of portions 43/44/45 of the farm 272.

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Orania Aandeleblok (RF)(PTY)LTD intends developing a residential area, an industrial area and a green area on portions 43/44/45 of farm 272 located east of the town Orania.

The aim of the study is to determine the localities of archaeological, historical and other cultural remains in relation to the proposed developments and to assess the impact of the developments on it.

Two unidentifiable stone engravings, one graffiti and a solitary Stone Age flake found is of low significance.

A fenced off cemetery in the industrial area footprint is however of local importance (Grade III A significance). It will have an impact on the development of the industrial area. A conservancy plan must be drawn up. The "Gemeenskap Dienste" section of Orania Dorpsraad is willing to assist in this respect. It is recommended that the proposed development proceed.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

Orania Aandeleblok (RF)(PTY)LTD intends the Vididex development of a residential area, an industrial area and a green area on portions 43/44/45 of farm 272. A heritage impact study is required and Shangoni Management Services (Pty) Ltd. was contracted. This report is done in terms of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999) and will be part of the EIA.

### 2. STUDY METHODOLOGY

The area (70 ha), proposed for development, was investigated on foot with the assistance of members of an off-road motorcycle club that has an obstacle course on the terrain. Interested students of a local school also took part. Observations and findings were plotted by GPS and recorded on camera. A GIS specialist was responsible for the maps. Prof Divid Morris of the Sol Plaatjie University, Kimberley, was consulted on the cemetery. Mr Renus Steyn, retired executive Officer of Orania Town Council provided information on the historical background of the cemetery. Because of the exceptional high summer rainfall, the area under investigation was mostly covered by thick grass making observation difficult, especially in the cemetery. Staff of Orania Gemeenskap Dienste assisted by cutting the grass in the cemetery by hand. It was done under supervision, taking care against damaging grave headstones or cultural objects placed on the graves. Afterwards Orania Veiligheidsdienste supplied a drone photo of the cemetery.

Previous archaeological and cultural heritage assessment studies in the region were done by Opperman (2012, 2013a, 2013b, 2016, 2017, 2021)

### 3. LOCALITIES (ANNEXURES A,B)

The area for the Vididex development lies directly east of Orania and south of the "servitude" dirt road that passes through Orania. According to Antoinette Eysel – Knox vegetation specialist (personal communication) the historical vegetation is Xhariep Karroid Grassland. The land surface is mostly shale with some dolerite on the western side. The dolerite is derived from dykes on top of the Karoo super group (Parkington et al 2008).

The cemetery is located close to the dirt road in the footprint area earmarked for industrial development.

Farm 272 belonged to DWA (1965 - 1990). The cemetery was used for burials of their workers who lived in Orania (Renus Steyn pers. Communication).

## 4. FINDINGS AND RECORDED FINDINGS (ANNEXURES C, D)

All recorded findings, except the position of each grave inside the cemetery, were plotted on maps (GIS format) (decimal degrees). Photos were taken. The two engravings are difficult to photograph and are described as unidentifiable. These, as well as one graffiti and a solitary Stone Age flake, will have no impact on the development.

The cemetery is described in detail. When found the site was heavily overgrown with grass and some shrubs. Some headstones were visible but the majority of graves were difficult to locate. Careful cutting of grass made it possible to establish the positions of at least 62 graves. Most of the graves (48) were concentrated on the western side of the cemetery in roughly parallel rows. The rest of the graves (17) were located in 2 rows against the eastern fence of the cemetery. The positions of most graves were shown by the greyish shale with which the graves were filled up. The cemetery was in a condition of total neglect with some vandalism visible as well as possibly aardvark making holes into some of the graves. Few graves still had cultural objects placed on it by family members. It was possible to recognize 5 types of graves:

- 1. Graves with formal headstones (5)
- 2. Graves with rock headstones (15)
- 3. Graves without headstones (36)
- 4. Graves covered by packed stones (2)
- 5. Graves with concrete block headstones (4)

### 5. ASSESMENT OF IMPACT

The impact on the proposed development is of low significance except for the cemetery which is of local importance (Grade III A significance)

#### 6. MITIGATION

A conservation plan must be drawn up for the protection and management of the cemetery.

#### 7. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that depending on the findings of other specialists, the proposed developments may proceed. It is possible that archaeological materials may appear during excavations for the building process. This phase should be monitored.

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






Vividex vegetation




