**Osborne Street, Bellville South**, examined the firearm/weapon described hereunder:

#### 1174 Firearms various

I **do not** consider the above firearm/weapon to be a Heritage Object as defined within  
the Act, for the following reasons:

None of this batch of firearms were of any heritage value, with single pieces being  
Martini Henry lever action rifles of commercial grade, two incomplete relic muzzle  
loaders, one commercial Snider long rifle incomplete, two Winchester lever action  
rifles, one military sub machine gun, the rest being insignificant modern shotguns,  
bolt action rifles and the majority pistols and revolvers.

The firearm/weapon was presented for examination by Lt. Col. Visser of the Western  
Cape SAPS CFR Storage facility on behalf of the custodian of the firearms intended  
for destruction in terms of the notice published in the Government Gazette dated 8<sup>th</sup> of
