The shopping centre is proposed to comprise 2 floors and maximise bulk of the site. Change in land use will entail change from informal trading and community facilities to higher order commercial / retail land use.

A preliminary identification of heritage sites in the area reveals that the site lies in close proximity to a number of heritage sites that may be affected by the proposed development (see diagram mapping heritage resources attached). The proposed development could potentially have an impact on sites related to the living environment and the liberation struggle route.
