INTRODUCTION

KwaDukuza Municipality intends construct the Proposed Sokesimbone Access Road in Sokesimbone rural village, within KwaDukuza Municipality in KwaZulu- Natal Province. The proposed Access Road construction includes lengthening of the existing tar road. This will take place on the existing vehicle tracks that are used to access the rural households. Lengthening of this road will promote community cohesions and it will benefit Sokesimbone people from community as well as the farmers. The development of the access roads in rural areas is very essential for the service delivery purposes.

Emvelo Consultant is the appointed as independent Environmental an Practitioner Assessing (EAP) KwaDukuza Municipality, to assess the possible impacts to the environment by the proposed road construction. This will allow the identification of all the negative impacts at an early stage of the project, the mitigation measures implemented to reduce the impacts and to ensure that the proposed project is shaped to suit the local environment.

WHAT DOES THIS DOCUMENT TELL YOU?

This document aims to provide you, as an Interested or Affected Party (I&AP), with an information regarding the Basic Assessment process for the proposed construction of Sokesimbone Access Road Phase 2. It aims to obtain comments and contributions from I&AP's with regard to potential impacts on the environment.

Any person, company, authority or other entity that might be directly or indirectly affected by the proposed activity is invited to register as an I&AP, in order to assist the EAP in identifying possible impacts and to make suggestions for mitigation. These comments will be included as part of the BAR which will be submitted to the Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (EDTEA) for environmental authorization.

The I &APs include, but not limited to landowners, tenants, municipal and provincial authorities, interest groups, Non-Government Organisation's and conservation groups.

This document details how you can become involved in the project, receive information, and raise any issues of concern or interest regarding the proposed project. The sharing of information forms the basis of the Public Participation Process and offers you the opportunity to become actively involved in the project from the outset. Input from I&APs ensures that all potential environmental issues are considered within the context of the proposed project.

STUDY AREA

The site is located in Sokesimbone and is approximately 30km south of the KwaDukuza CBD. Access to the site is via the R102 and existing Ohlange municipal access roads.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed project entails the lengthening of the existing tar road by 1 km and 4.5 m in width. Lengthening of the tar road will take place on the existing track road and will cross the stream. Box culverts will be used as the causeway structures.

WHAT IS A BASIC ASSESSMENT REPORT?

A Basic Assessment Report (BAR) is an effective planning and decision-making tool, which allows for the identification of potential environmental consequences of a proposed project, and its management through the planning process.

WHY IS BASIC ASSESSMENT REQUIRED?

National In terms of to the Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No.107 of 1998), as read with the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations of 04 December 2014, an Environmental Authorization must be obtained from the relevant decisionmaking authority, the Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (DEDTEA), prior to the commencement of certain listed activities that may result in potential negative impacts on the environment. The proposed activity triggers the following listed activity in Listing Notice 1 (GNR 983, 04 December 2014).
