In terms of Regulation 4(2) of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2014, as amended (the EIA Regulations), you are instructed to notify all registered interested and affected parties, in writing and within fourteen (14) days of the the date of the Record of Refusal, of the Competent Authority's decision as well as the provisions regarding the submission of appeals that are contained in the EIA Regulations.

In terms of the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act, 2000 (Act No 3 of 2000), you are entitled to the right to fair, lawful and reasonable administrative action; and to written reasons for administrative action that affects you negatively. Further your attention is drawn to the provisions of the Protection of Personal Information Act, 2013 (Act no. 4 of 2013) which stipulates that the Competent Authority should conduct itself in a responsible manner when collecting, processing, storing and sharing an individual or another entity's personal information by holding the Competent Authority accountable should the Competent Authority abuses or compromises your personal information in any way.

Your attention is drawn to Chapter 2 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) National Appeal Regulations published under Government Notice R993 in Government Gazette No. 38303 dated 08 December 2014 (National Appeal Regulations, 2014), which prescribe the appeal procedure to be followed. Kindly include a copy of this document (National Appeal Regulations, 2014) with the letter of notification to interested and affected parties in this matter.

Should any person wish to lodge an appeal against this decision, he/she must submit the appeal to the appeal administrator, and a copy of the appeal to the applicant, any registered interested and affected party, and any organ of state with interest in the matter within 20 days from the date that the notification of the decision was sent to the registered interested and affected parties by the applicant; or the date that the notification of the decision was sent to the applicant by the Department, whichever is applicable.

#### The facility will comprise the following:

- up to 61 wind turbines, with a generation capacity of between 4.5 and 7.5 MW per turbine (depending on the available technology at the time),
- turbines will have a hub height of up to 150m and a rotor diameter of up to 175m;
- onsite substation/s of 100mX100m (33/132kV) to facilitate the connection between the WEF and Aggeneys Substation,

- a Battery Energy Storage System (BESS),
- · concrete foundations to support turbine towers,
- cabling between turbines, to be laid underground where practical,
- internal/ access roads (up to 10 m in width) linking the wind turbines and other infrastructure on the site,
- permanent workshop area and office for control, maintenance and storage, and
- temporary laydown areas during the construction phase (which will be rehabilitated).

1. The application for Environmental Authorisation is refused for the up to 270 MW wind energy facility and associated infrastructure remaining extent of the Farm Kliphakskeen 98 and portion 1 of the Farm Kliphakskeen 98, in the Nama-Khoi Local Municipality within the Northern Cape province, as described above.

#### Notification of refusal and right to appeal

- 2. The applicant must notify every registered interested and affected party, of the Competent Authority's decision, in writing and within 14 (fourteen) calendar days of the date of this record of refusal.
- 3. The notification referred to must
  - 3.1. specify the date on which the record of refusal was issued;
  - 3.2. inform the interested and affected party of the appeal procedure provided for in the National Appeal Regulations, 2014;
  - 3.3. advise the interested and affected party that a copy of the record of refusal will be furnished on request; and,
  - 3.4. give the reasons of the CA for the decision.

## 1. Information considered in making the decision

- b) The information contained in the BAR dated January 2023.
- c) The comments received from interested and affected parties as included in the BAR dated January 2023.
- d) Mitigation measures as proposed in the BAR dated January 2023.
- e) The information contained in the specialist studies contained within the appendices of the BAR dated January 2023 and as appears below:

f) The objectives and requirements of relevant legislation, policies and guidelines, including section 2 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act 107 of 1998).

#### 2. Key factors considered in making the decision

All information presented to the Department was considered in the Department's consideration of the application. A summary of the issues which, in the Department's view, were of the most significance is set out below.

- a) The information contained in the application form, the final BAR dated January 2023 and the amended application form submitted therein.
- b) The findings of all the specialist studies conducted and their recommended mitigation measures.
- c) The comments received by various I&APs and the responses thereto as contained in Appendix E of the BAR.
- d) The comments provided by the Chief Directorate: Integrated Environmental Authorisations on the draft BAR on the 25 November 2022, respectively.

#### 3. Findings

After consideration of the information and factors listed above, the Department made the following findings -

- a) The CA advised the EAP during the comment period on the draft BAR to clearly identify and provide a final list of all applicable listed and specified activities and to include reference to the onsite substation.
- b) Furthermore, the CA advised that a GEMPr was required to be submitted as the proposed development triggered Activity 11 of Listing Notice 1. Paragraph (i) (ii) of the comment letter on the Draft BAR stated that:

It is drawn to your attention that the substation and the overhead electricity transmission and distribution infrastructure which trigger activity 11 or 47 of the Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations Listing Notice 1 of 2014, as amended, and any other listed and specified activities necessary for the realisation of such facilities, require the submission of a GEMPr as contemplated in Regulations 23(4). Please make note of Part B Section 2 of the GEMPr requirement which states that:

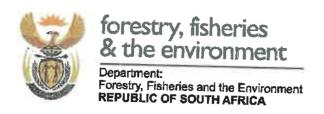
"This section must be submitted to the CA together with the final BAR or EIAR. The information submitted to the CA will be incomplete should a signed copy of Part B: section 2 not be submitted. Once approved, this Section forms part of the EMPr for the development and is legally binding."

Ensure that signed versions of the GEMPr for the substation are submitted with the final BAR. This is over and above the EMPr for the facility.

- c) Based on the Comments and Response report in Appendix E of the Final BAR, the EAP responded regarding the listed activities and the generic EMPr that
  - 'Listed activities have been updated accordingly' and that
  - 'The onsite substation will not be included in this application but will be included in the Grid line application;' and
  - '(ii) The onsite substation and grid connection will be applied for in a separate application, the generic EMPr will be used for that Application.'
  - However, Activity 11 of Listing Notice 1, was not removed from the application form.
- The submission of the GEMPr is a legislative requirement in terms of GN No. 435 dated 22 March 2019 in instances where activity 11 of Listing Notice 1 of the EIA Regulations, 2014 as amended is triggered.

  As such, the generic EMPr for overhead electricity transmission and distribution infrastructure as set out in Appendix 2 of GN No. 435, should have been included in the draft and final BARs.
- e) The Basic Assessment process was compromised as the applicant failed to comply with the requirements prescribed in terms of GN No. 435 dated 22 March 2019 regarding the submission of the generic EMPr.

Consequently there is no sufficient, adequate and reliable basis upon which the statutory discretion of the CA can be exercised in favour of the applicant and therefore the application for Environmental Authorisation is refused.
