### PERMIT

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

The following conditions apply:

1. SAHRA has noted the names of crew on site during filming to be as follows: Sanet Olivier, Chris Lotz, Grant Wells, Claudio Velasquez, Farrel Saunders, JP van der Linde and Gavin Whitelaw.
2. The permit holder must *contract* a qualified professional qualified archaeologist to monitor activities on site during filming. We understand that Dr Johan Binneman will assist with monitoring. Such monitoring should take place at all times when your crew is on site.
3. The archaeologist must be consulted prior to activities commencing on site to advise on any archaeologically sensitive areas which must be avoided;
4. The amount of traffic, ie. numbers of people on site, should be minimized as much as possible to avoid excessive disturbance of the site.
5. A report on activities related to the permit must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 01 April 2012. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if a report is not received or not satisfactory.
6. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports/film resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
7. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and the applicant is responsible for ensuring that he or she has an understanding with the landowner concerning: the number of visitors and workers; speed limits on access roads; possible prohibitions on off-road driving; size, type and number of vehicles permitted; possible prohibitions on trespassing beyond the site; disturbing fauna, flora or substrate; appropriate hours of visiting and working on the site; use of electricity and water; lighting fires and the prevention of uncontrolled fires and any fencing necessary to protect livestock. Conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
8. The applicant shall be responsible for the activities and impacts of all colleagues and employees under his or her supervision and for their compliance with the terms of the permit.
9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to protect sites during and after filming and to) to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
10. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
11. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.
