PERMIT

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr Steven Brian Cohen,

of: 32 Princes Street, Troyeville, 2094, Johannesburg,

for: filming at Sterkfontein and Swartkrans, in: the Krugersdorp District, Gauteng Province.

The following conditions apply:

- 1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
- The permit holder must contract a qualified professional palaeoanthropologist to monitor activities on site during filming. We understand that Prof Francis Thackeray will assist and you may make arrangements for him to monitor. Should Prof Thackeray not be able to monitor filming activities at all times, then SAHRA must be informed of the name and qualifications of the person who will stand in his stead. Such monitoring should take place at all times when your crew is on site.
- 3. The palaeonthropologist must be consulted prior to activities commencing on site to advise on any archaeologically sensitive areas which must be avoided;
- 4. The amount of traffic, ie. numbers of people on site, should be minimized as much as possible to avoid excessive disturbance of the site.
- 5. A progress report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 01 September 2012. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
- 6. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports/film resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and the applicant is responsible for ensuring that he or she has an understanding with the landowner concerning: the number of visitors and workers; speed limits on access roads; possible prohibitions on off-road driving; size, type and number of vehicles permitted; possible prohibitions on trespassing beyond the site; disturbing fauna, flora or substrate; appropriate hours of visiting and working on the site; use of electricity and water; lighting fires and the prevention of uncontrolled fires and any fencing necessary to protect livestock. Conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
- 8. The applicant shall be responsible for the activities and impacts of all colleagues and employees under his or her supervision and for their compliance with the terms of the permit.
- 9. The applicant, including colleagues and visitors under the direct supervision of the permit holder must carry documents of identification indicating their legitimacy to be on the National Heritage Site.
- 10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to protect sites during and after filming and to) to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
- 11. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 12. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.
