PERMIT No. 80/08/12/004/61

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

- to: Mr Tom Kelly, Acting Regional Manager, SA National Roads Agency Ltd, P.O. Box 27230, Greenacres, Port Elizabeth,
- for: disturbance of a palaeontological heritage site for the purposes of stabilizing and securing late Devonian fossiliferous deposit of international heritage significance,
- at: the Waterloo Farm, on the bypass cutting, of the National Route 2, section 13,
- in: the Grahamstown District, Eastern Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

- 1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the person/s authorised to represent him / her.
- 2. Mr Rob Gess must be appointed to monitor all activities on site and rescue any fossils encountered. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be employed. Note that the position of all excavations and objects collected must be marked on a plan of site.
- 3. All fossils collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, are to be curated by the Albany Museum.
- 4. A fence protecting the site for the future is to be erected. SAHRA will require a map and details of placement and design for approval. This is discussed further in the accompanying permit letter.
- 5. A final report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 February 2010. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
- 7. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 8. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
- 9. This permit is subject to a general appeal and may be suspended should an appeal against the decisions be received by SAHRA within 14 days from the date of the permit. SAHRA may not be held responsible for any costs or losses incurred in the event of the suspension or retraction of this permit.
