PERMIT

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

- to: Mr Ryan Gibbon (ID: 8001285060083) in association with Dr K Kuman (US passport: 710378408),
- of: School of Geography, Archaeology and Environmental Studies, University of the Witwatersrand, Private Bag 3, WITS, 2050, Johannesburg,
- for: excavation in the Earlier Stone Age layers as indicated in the map accompanying the permit application with the intention of assessing the typological sequence and, in particular, changes in core preparation at a single site over a lengthy period of the Earlier Stone Age sequence,
- at: Canteen Kopje, at approximately 28° 32′ 30″S, 24° 31′ 52″E,
- in: the Barkley West District, Northern Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

- 1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
- 2. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of all excavations must be marked on a plan of each site.
- 3. Any witness sections that Peter Beaumont considers significant should be retained unless it can be shown that they have or will be replaced by better ones.
- 4. Supply a site plan (either separately or in collaboration with Chazan and Morris) on which is annotated all current historical excavations (and dumps), witness sections, and significant strata and other significant aspects of the site.
- 5. A standard site record form must be lodged with the McGregor Museum.
- 6. All material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the McGregor Museum.
- 7. A progress report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 July 2008 and 1 July 2009 and a final report is due on or before 1 July 2010. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
- 8. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
- 9. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
- 10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
- 11. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
- 12. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 13. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
- 14. This permit is subject to a general appeal and may be suspended should an appeal against the decisions be received by SAHRA within 14 days from the date of the permit. SAHRA may not be held responsible for any costs or losses incurred in the event of the suspension or retraction of this permit.
