## **PERMIT**

No. 80/11/08/006/51

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

- to: Dr William Robert Challis in association with Mr W Archer and Mr H Pinto and collaborators Dr B Stewart and Dr G Dewar,
- of: Department of Archaeology and Rock Art Research Institute, School of Geography, Archaeology and Environmental Studies, University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, Private Bag 3, WITS, 2050,
- for: excavation at Mafusing rock shelter,
- at: approximately S 30° 9' 59", E 28° 37' 1.2",
- in: the Matatiele District, Eastern Cape Province.

## The following conditions apply:

- 1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
- 2. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of all excavations must be marked on a plan of each site.
- 3. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Albany Museum.
- 4. All material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the Albany Museum.
- 5. A progress report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 01 October 2012 and 01 October 2013 and a final report is due on or before 01 October 2014. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
- 6. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
- 7. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
- 8. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
- 9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
- 10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to ensure that the rock art is not impacted on by activities related to this permit and its associated research programs.
- 11. No sieving or dust generating activities must be done adjacent to the rock art.
- 12. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 13. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
