PERMIT

No. 80/08/07/006/61

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

- to: Mr T Kelly (ID: 4708245001080), Acting Regional Manager,
- of: South African National Roads Agency Limited, P.O. Box 27230, Greenacres, Port Elizabeth,
- for: the collection of loose rubble that has fallen from the Section 13 of the N2 bypass which may contain Late Devonian fossil material, (but not including the disturbance of any material from the cutting section currently *in situ*),
- at: Waterloo Farm, at approximately 33° 19' 23.99"S, 26° 32' 13.63"E,
- in: the Grahamstown District, Eastern Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

- 1. This permit allows for the recovery of only the loose material (potentially fossiliferous) that has spilled into the road at Section 13 of the N2 bypass as a result of a collapse. A second permit will required for the mitigation of the affected cutting wall. A qualified palaeontologist with an appropriate permit must be on site at all times during clearing operation of the fossil material. The palaeontologist must monitor the clearing procedure to rescue any fossils and there must be agreement before this commences that the palaeontologist may stop activities related to this permit should it become necessary. It is noted that loose material collected in the road that does not contain fossils may be used as fill. Such material must be approved by the palaeontologist before clearing commences.
- 2. Please note that the permit allows only for the collection and removal of the loose material in the road. This does not include any disturbance or alteration of the material in the wall of the cutting. A second permit will be required for the next phase relating to the support of the section exposed and this may need to be a separate application to SAHRA APM Unit.
- 3. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
- 4. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be employed. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Albany Museum.
- 6. A report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 October 2009. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
- 7. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
- 8. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to and protect sites during and after rescue to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
- 10. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 11. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder. This permit is subject to a general appeal and may be suspended should an appeal against the decisions be received by SAHRA within 14 days from the date of the permit. SAHRA may not be held responsible for any costs or losses incurred in the event of the suspension or retraction of this permit.
