The following conditions apply:

- 1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times, then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
- 2. Photos of the panels must be taken before and after the conservation work is undertaken.
- 3. The applicant must keep a full record of the conservation techniques and of the material used during the conservation work.

- 4. Wherever possible, the conservation principle of reversibility must be adhered to.
- 5. A floor plan showing movements of the rocks and of the new infrastructure must be included in the interim and final reports to be submitted to SAHRA.
- 6. Progress reports must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 May 2013 and 1 May 2014. The final report is due on or before 1 May 2015. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
- 7. Reprints of all published papers or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
- 8. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
- 9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit. Conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
- 10. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 11. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
