### **PERMANENT EXPORT PERMIT**

No. 80/09/11/010/52

Issued under Sections 32 and 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999.  
Permission is hereby given:

to: Dr C.W. Marean (Passport: 208788907),  
of: the Institute of Human Origins, School of Human Evolution and Social Change, Arizona State University, Tempe, AZ 85278-2402, USA and Dias Museum, 1 Market Street, Mossel Bay, 6500, South Africa,  
for: the export of samples of sediment and rock taken from the excavations (PP5-6) and non-archaeological settings at Pinnacle Point. The sample sizes will be mostly small cubes (2 cm per side) of sediments taken from PP5-6 and some modern soil samples totalling about 1000 samples. The bulk of the samples will remain in South Africa,  
from: Pinnacle Point Caves, Mossel Bay, Western Cape Province, currently store at the Munro House (Mossel Bay Archaeology Project Laboratory) Dias Museum in Mossel Bay,

for: analysis and dating

The following conditions apply:

1. Each artefact or specimen must be clearly marked with the accession number.
2. The material must be carefully packed and all packaging must be clearly marked with the accession numbers, the name of the site, and the name and address of the permit holder or the Dias Museum.
3. The samples must be kept for study purposes only, and may not be sold or exchanged.
4. Copies of any papers that may result from the export of the material must be lodged with SAHRA. A report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 01 February 2010.
5. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
6. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
7. This permit is subject to a general appeal and may be suspended should an appeal against the decisions be recieved by SAHRA within 14 days from the date of the permit. SAHRA may not be held responsible for any costs or losses incurred in the event of the suspension or retraction of this permit.
