Issued under Section 36(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr HS Steyn (ID710915526909) & Dr W.C. Nienaber,  
of: Professional Graves Solutions, P.O. Box 14706,  
for: exhumation of graves older than 60 years in a cemetery of c. 26 graves,  
at: Zonkiszwe, south of the Grand Central Airport in Midrand,  
on: the farm Randjesfontein 405JR,  
for: reburial at Waterval Municipal Cemetery (Midrand).  
in: Gauteng Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. It is understood that every effort was made to avoid relocating this graveyard but that it was not possible in the light of the Gautrain development. The original layout of the cemetery will be recreated. The reburial will be done by Twala Ama Afrika Funeral Directors.
2. If the permit holder is not present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
3. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. The position of the grave must be marked on a plan of the site, and the site marked on a 1:50 000 map.
4. Human remains must at all times be handled with respect and graves should not be disturbed except where unavoidable. The consultation procedures as indicated in the gazetted regulations of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act No. 25 of 1999) must be observed as appropriate.
5. Field notes and records will be curated at the University of Pretoria.
6. A report on the excavation must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 October 2009.
7. Reprints of all published papers, copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with the relevant Provincial Heritage Resources Authority and SAHRA. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
8. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of the SAHRA and the landowner.
12. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
13. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
14. This permit is subject to a general appeal and may be suspended should an appeal against the decisions be received by SAHRA within 14 days from the date of the permit. SAHRA may not be held responsible for any costs or losses incurred in the event of the suspension or retraction of this permit.

This permit is valid until 1 October 2009.
