PERMANENT EXPORT PERMIT

Issued under Sections 32 and 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

- to: Dr C.W. Marean (USA Passport 208788907),
of: the Institute of Human Origins, School of Human Evolution and Social Change, Arizona State University, Tempe, AZ 85207, USA and Dias Museum, 1 Market Street, Mossel Bay, 6500, South Africa,
for: the permanent export of sediment samples and rock samples taken from excavations from Pinnacle Point 5-6 and some geological samples (non-archaeological settings), totaling to about 1000 samples (mostly small cubes of about 2 cm per side),
from: samples stored at Munro House (Mossel Bay Archaeology Project Laboratory) Diaz Museum in Mossel Bay,
to: Dr Andy Herries,

for: magnetic susceptibility measurements and analysis.

1. Each artefact or specimen must be clearly marked with the accession number.
2. The material must be carefully packed and all packaging must be clearly marked with the accession numbers, the name of the site, and the name and address of the permit holder or the Bartholemeu Dias Museum.
3. The samples must be kept for study purposes only, and may not be sold or exchanged.
4. Copies of any papers that may result from the export of the material must be lodged with SAHRA. A report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 01 January 2013.
5. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
6. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
