### **PERMIT**

No. 80/08/09/017/51

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr Carlos Galego,  
of: 2nd floor, Building 17, The Woodlands, 20 Woodlands Drive, Woodmead, Sandton,  
for: the destruction of part of an archaeological stone wall site associated with the Late Iron Age and early Voortrekker farming, that will be impacted by the development of the New Multi Purpose Pipeline for Transnet,  
at: Site KP67, at approximately 25 47 21.9S, 28 29 27.1E,  
on: Portion 12 of the farm Donkerhoek 365JR,  
in: the Pretoria District, Gauteng Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. Only the portion of the site to be affected as noted in the application (annexure A) must be disturbed. Should it become clear, in consultation with a qualified Iron Age specialist, that a larger more significant portion of the site will be damaged the SAHRA APM Unit must be notified.
2. An archaeologist, accredited for Iron Age, must monitor the excavation of the pipelines in the event any other archaeological material is unearthed.
3. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
4. A report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 January 2010. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
5. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
6. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to protect the remainder of the site during and after excavation of the pipeline to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
7. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
8. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
9. This permit is subject to a general appeal and may be suspended should an appeal against the decisions be received by SAHRA within 14 days from the date of the permit. SAHRA may not be held responsible for any costs or losses incurred in the event of the suspension or retraction of this permit.

This permit is valid until 1 January 2010.
