PERMIT

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

- to: Ms Karen van Ryneveld (ID: 7111100183082), in association with Dr Peter Nilssen acting as Principal Investigator for the project,
- of: ArchaeoMaps, Postnet Suite 239, Private Bag X3, Beacon Bay, 5205, and CHARM, P.O. Box 176, Great Brak River, 6525,
- for: the excavation of at least eight test pits along the line of three turbines (33-36) of the Central Cluster of the Red Cap Kouga Wind farm, to determine whether any archaeological site or sub-surface deposits are located in the area; and for the monitoring of the line of turbines 41-40-48 located 1km west of the line 33-36,
- in: the Kouga Municipality District, near the town of Cape St Francis, Eastern Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

- 1. Activities must be monitored by the applicant and overseen by Dr Nilssen. If any archaeological material is identified during test excavation and monitoring, excavation will be stopped and a way forward discussed by the project team, the Gamtkwa KhoiSan Council and SAHRA.
- 2. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
- 3. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of all excavations must be marked on a plan of each site.
- 4. A report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 01 April 2013. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
- 5. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
- 6. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
- 8. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
- 9. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.

10. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
