Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999.  
Permission is hereby given:

to: Dr P.J. Nilssen (ID: 6412145081080) in association with Mr FB Silberbauer,  
of: the Mossel Bay Archaeology Project, P O Box 176, Great Brak River, 6525,  
for: the phase 2 archaeological mitigation of sites 30 through 39 and sites uncovered during  
monitoring of earth moving activities, endangered by proposed development,  
at: Cape St Francis Bay, at approximately 34 09.845S, 24 48.669E,  
on: the farm Goede Geloof No. 745, erven 164 and 175,  
in: the Humansdorp District, Eastern Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. The Principal Investigator must visit the site at least at the beginning to ensure that the process follows previously established standards.
2. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
3. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of all excavations must be marked on a plan of each site.
4. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Albany Museum.
5. All material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the Albany Museum.
6. A report on activities connected with this permit must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 April 2007 and 1 April 2008 and a final report is due on or before 1 April 2009. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
7. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
8. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
11. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
12. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.

This permit is valid until 1 April 2009.
