PERMIT

Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

to: Dr JNF Binneman (ID: 5310315127082),
of: Albany Museum, Somerset Street, Grahamstown, 6140,
for: the rescue excavation of a partial burial, part of which was removed and collected by the police, in the dunefield,
at: New Papiessfontein,
in: the Humansdorp District, Eastern Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. SAHRA understands that Dr Binneman will rescue the bones still on site, record the site, and will lodge the material in the police mortuary. The police have agreed to transport the material to Cape Town for analysis after which it will be returned to the Albany Museum until such time as the community and stakeholders have decided on the way forward.
2. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
3. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of all excavations must be marked on a plan of each site.
4. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Albany Museum.
5. All remains recovered, including relics and artefacts, as well as field notes and records, must be kept with the skeletal material and be curated at the Albany Museum.
6. Human remains must at all times be handled with respect and graves should not be disturbed except where unavoidable. The recommendations for removal of graves and exhumations and for re-burial made in SAHRA's Policy 'What to do when graves are uncovered', section 3, must be observed as far as possible.
7. A report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 November 2006. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
8. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
9. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
11. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
12. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
13. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.

This permit is valid until 1 November 2006.
