4. The material may not be loaned to any person or institution other than Dr B Ngubane without the consent of SAHRA.
5. The material shall be returned to South Africa on or before 1 April 2006 at the expense of Dr B Ngubane.
6. SAHRA must be notified in writing of the return of the material, and a report on the activities undertaken in terms of this permit must be lodged with SAHRA before 1 April 2006.
7. Copies of all papers or publications resulting from this permit must be lodged with SAHRA.
8. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
9. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
