- 4. In such event, a <u>written motivation</u> in support of such deviation must be submitted to AMAFA AKWAZULU-NATALI for consideration and;
- 5. No deviation from the (plans, drawings) will be undertaken without the **prior written approval** of Amafa aKwaZulu-Natali.
- 6. In the case of the demolition of a structure/s or part thereof, such demolition must take place <u>not more</u> <u>than 30 days</u> prior to the commencement of the alterations and or additions, unless otherwise agreed to, in writing, by Amafa aKwaZulu-Natali;
- 7. Amafa aKwaZulu-Natali shall have the right to inspect the site where the alteration, addition, demolition is to be undertaken **prior** to the commencement of the work, for the purpose of identifying salvageable elements which will not be required for re-use in the above project.
- 8. All salvageable elements identified must be delivered to the Amafa Conservation Materials Bank at the Applicant's cost.
- 9. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE CONDITIONS WILL RENDER ANY DEVIATION FROM THE ORIGINAL (PLANS) UNLAWFUL, AND AMAFA-AKWAZULU NATALI RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INSTITUTE CRIMINAL AND/OR CIVIL ACTION AGAINST THE PERSON/S RESPONSIBLE.
- 10. The issuing of this permit does not exempt the Applicant from obtaining the approval of the Local



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Authority or any other Authority, where required, for the proposed additions and or alterations.
