PERMIT: Excavation, Sampling

In terms of Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Site: Site Stone Age Open Air scatter (Site 2 Stone Age Open Air, Site 4 Stone Age)

For recording and surface sampling of the following sites: Site 2 on the farm La Motte 464LT and Site 4 on the farm Riverside 514LT, Tzaneen/Letsitele area, Limpopo Province.

Conditions:

1. This permit is issued to Dr Anton Pelsler.
2. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
3. Mitigation methods include laying out of 1x1 m grids and photographing, mapping, counting and detailed description of all archaeological features within each grid section. Representative specimens within the grid squares will be sampled and accessioned by the Lydenburg Museum. Sampled material will be bagged according to the accessioning museum's standard. Mapping will be done using theodolites and GPS.
4. An adequate map of the sites must be created and provided to SAHRA.
5. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be employed. Note that the position of all excavations and objects collected must be marked on a plan of the site.
6. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Lydenburg Museum.
7. All material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the Lydenburg Museum, who will be responsible for the permanent curation and safekeeping of all artefactual material in a



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condition that allows ongoing research.

8. A final report on the results of the mitigation and analyses must be submitted to SAHRA permit on or before 30 September 2017. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.

9. Reprints of all published papers or copies of theses and/or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.

10. The final permit report can be made available to researchers on request within three years of the lapsing of this permit.

11. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and the excavator is responsible for ensuring that he or she has an understanding with the landowner concerning: the number of visitors and workers; conditions for camping on the property; speed limits on access roads; possible prohibitions on off-road driving; size, type and number of vehicles permitted; possible prohibitions on trespassing beyond the site; disturbing fauna, flora or substrate; erection and demolition of structures on the site; appropriate hours of visiting and working on the site; use of firewood, electricity and water; lighting fires and the prevention of uncontrolled fires and any fencing necessary to protect livestock. Conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.

12. The permitted excavator shall be responsible for the activities and impacts of all colleagues, students and employees under his or her supervision.

13. Excavators must take measures to ensure the safety of any person who may enter the excavation site as part of their excavation team or as their visitor.

14. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to protect sites during and after excavation and to ensure that, where appropriate, excavations are filled in or stabilised with adequate materials (e.g. Loffelstein blocks or army bags in geotextile) to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.

15. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.

16. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.
