Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999 and the Western Cape Provincial Gazette 6061, Notice 298 of 2003. Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr. Stephen Henry le Roux,
of: the NDC Mining Pty Ltd, PO Box 108, Lutzville, 8165,
for: excavation, destruction, damage and disturbance,
at: NDC Mining, at approximately 31 25 20 S, 17 58 15 E,
on: the farm Koekenaap, Plot 514, Liebenberg Bay mining area,
in: the Vredendal District, Western Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then HWC must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorized representatives.
2. An experienced professional archaeologist must monitor earth-moving operations during the stripping of top soil from each mining block within the Liebenberg Bay area.
3. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Given the scale of earth-moving operations in the Liebenberg area, the position of any archaeological finding must be marked on a 1:10 000 map or aerial photograph.
4. A standard site record form must be lodged with the IZIKO: South African Museum.
5. All material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the IZIKO: South African Museum.
6. A progress report must be submitted to HWC on or before 1 July 2005 and 1 July 2006 and a final report is due on or before 1 July 2007. HWC reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
7. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with HWC.
8. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of HWC and the landowner.
11. HWC shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
12. HWC reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.

This permit is valid until 1 July 2007.
