**TEMPORARY EXPORT PERMIT**

No. 80/04/06/012/52

Issued under Sections 32 and 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr R Yates,  
of: the Iziko: South African Museum, P.O. Box 61, Cape Town, 8001,  
for: the temporary export of 12 *Pelorovis antiquus* tooth fragments from Upper Pleistocene MSA levels at Klasies River main site (accession number: SAM-AA 8778, loan number: 4367),  
from: Klasies River Caves, Humansdorp, Eastern Cape Province,  
to: Dr A Horsburgh, c/o Dr Lisa Matisoo-Smith,  
of: Department of Anthropology, University of Auckland, Human Sciences Building, 10 Symond Street, Auckland, New Zealand,  
for: DNA analysis.

The following conditions apply:

1. It is understood that only fragmentary teeth will be used for this purpose and that all residues will be returned.
2. The material must be carefully packed and all packaging must be clearly marked with the accession numbers, the name of the site, and the name and address of the permit holder or the custodian.
3. The material may not be loaned to any person or institution other than Dr Horsburgh without the consent of SAHRA.
4. The residue material shall be returned to South Africa on or before 1 July 2005 at the expense of Dr Horsburgh.
5. SAHRA must be notified in writing of the return of the material, and a report on the activities undertaken in terms of this permit must be lodged with SAHRA before 1 July 2005.
6. Copies of all papers or publications resulting from this permit must be lodged with SAHRA.
7. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
8. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.

This permit is valid until 1 July 2005.
