**PERMIT**

No. 80/03/06/001/ 51

Issued under Section 36(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999. Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr T.J.G. Hart,  
of: the Archaeology Contracts Office, University of Cape Town, Private Bag, Rondebosch 7701,  
for: rescue exhumation of human skeletal remains,  
at: Prestwich Place, the city block bounded  
by: Prestwich, Alfred, Schriebe and West Streets,  
in: the Cape Town District, Western Cape Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
2. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of the graves must be marked on a plan of the site, and the site marked on an appropriate map.
3. A standard site record form must be lodged with the IZIKO (South African) Museum.
4. Human remains must at all times be handled with respect and graves should not be disturbed except where unavoidable.
5. The consultation procedures as indicated in the gazetted regulations of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act No. 25 of 1999) must be observed as appropriate. The recommendations for removal of graves and exhumations and for re-burial made in SAHRA's Policy 'What to do when graves are uncovered', section 3, must be observed as far as possible. In cognisance of the circumstances preceding the notification to SAHRA of possible human remains on this site, SAHRA has advised the proponent to proceed simultaneously with the archaeological investigation and the consultation process. It is understood that after preliminary investigation as well as preliminary notification of possible interested parties, there will be a reassessment of the process, after which SAHRA may reassess the conditions of this permit.
5. Field notes and records must be curated at the University of Cape Town.
6. All material including associated artefacts will be curated at the University of Cape Town temporarily until the process of consultation has allowed SAHRA to determine the appropriate repository, which may be re-interment in a crypt on site.
7. A report on the process must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 July 2004.
8. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with the relevant Provincial Heritage Resources Authority and SAHRA. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
11. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of the SAHRA and the landowner.
12. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
13. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.

This permit is valid until 1 July 2004.
