Issued under Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act No. 25 of 1999.
Permission is hereby given:

to: Mr B van Lente,
of: the Vhembe Dongola National Park, PO Box 383, Musina, 0900,
for: possible archaeological excavation which may be necessary during the construction of
a water pipeline which would follow the Schroda mine road which would enable
sufficient water supply to the proposed Interpretive Center and museum on Hamilton
farm,
at: Mapungubwe Cultural Landscape,
on: the farm Schroda 46MS,
in: the Messina District, Limpopo Province.

The following conditions apply:

1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then SAHRA must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
2. In the event that archaeological features and artefacts are uncovered during trenching, work should cease and the monitoring archaeologist be informed immediately.
3. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used. Note that the position of all excavations must be marked on a plan of each site.
4. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Polokwane Museum.
5. All material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the University of Pretoria.
6. A progress report must be submitted to SAHRA on or before 1 September 2004 and a final report is due on or before 1 September 2005. SAHRA reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
7. Reprints of all published papers, or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with SAHRA.
8. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
10. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of SAHRA and the landowner.
11. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
12. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.
