- 3. The material may not be loaned to any person or institution other than Mr Corwin Sullivan, of the Museum of Comparative Zoology, at Harvard University, in the United States of America, without the consent of SAHRA.
- 4. The material shall be returned to South Africa on or before 1 July 2004 at the expense of the permit holder.
- 5. SAHRA must be notified in writing of the return of the material, and a report on the activities undertaken in terms of this permit must be lodged with SAHRA before 1 July 2004.
- 6. Copies of all papers or publications resulting from this permit must be lodged with SAHRA.
- 7. SAHRA shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 8. SAHRA reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.
