## Conditions:

- 1. The heritage authority has noted that the crew on site during filming will be composed by 36 crew and cast members.

It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and the applicant is responsible for ensuring that he has an understanding with the landowner concerning: the number of visitors and workers; speed limits on access roads; possible prohibitions on off-road driving; size, type and number of vehicles permitted; possible prohibitions on trespassing beyond the site; disturbing fauna, flora or substrate; appropriate hours of visiting and working on the site; use of electricity and water; lighting fires and the prevention of uncontrolled fires and any fencing necessary to protect livestock. Conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
- 8. The applicant shall be responsible for the activities and impacts of all colleagues and employees under his supervision and for their compliance with the terms of the permit.

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- 9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to protect sites during and after filming and to the satisfaction of the heritage authority and the landowner.
- 10. The heritage authority shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
- 11. The heritage authority reserves the right to cancel this permit upon notice to the permit holder.
