Site: Robben Island Cooling Pond (RI CP) approximately at 33° 48' 37.3212" S, 18° 22' 45.3108" E

For:

Excavation of the cooling pond dated to the Second World War on Robben Island and excavation of the possible archaeological deposit beneath it.

SAHRA acknowledges that this permit is issued retrospectively and that the excavation for which the conditions are set out below had already been undertaken from the 5th to the 9th of March 2012.

A final report from the excavation was received by SAHRA on the 10th of July 2012.

Conditions:

1. If the permit holder is not to be present on the site at all times then the heritage authority must be provided with the names and qualifications of the authorised representatives.
2. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be employed. Note that the position of all excavations and objects collected must be marked on a plan of site.
3. A standard site record form must be lodged with the Robben Island Museum.
4. All archaeological material collected and excavated, as well as field notes and records, will be curated by the Robben Island Museum.
5. A draft report on the results of the excavations and analyses must be submitted to the heritage authority issuing this permit on or before the 1st of March 2013.
6. Reprints of all published papers or copies of theses and/or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with the heritage authority.
7. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report required in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
8. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed by the landowner must be observed.
9. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to fill in excavations and protect sites during and after excavation to the satisfaction of the heritage authority and the landowner.
10. The heritage authority shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties


