The claimed grave will be reburied at Rondebult Cemetery as per the request by the family; the remaining 45 will be reburied at Kromvlei Cemetery. Mosaic Funeral Group will be responsible for the handling and reburial of the exhumed human remains. This permit is allocated for the exhumation and re-internment of all 46 graves according to section 36 of the NHRA 25 of 1999.
