	the meeting as the start of public participation necessary before the	
	disposal of the human remains found at the site.

	Dr Matenga explained the procedures for the disposal of	
	unidentified human remains as laid out in Section 36 of the National	
	Heritage Resources Act (No 25/ 1999) and SAHRA regulations	
	gazetted in year 2000. Importantly the public, in particular local	
	communities had to be informed about the discoveries as an	
	attempt to identify the remains. In addition to meetings	
	announcements via public media such as locally circulating	
	newspapers and/or radio would ensure wider circulation and	
	penetration of the message. The heritage authority will require a	
	formal letter from the SAPS in the area confirming that they had	
	handled the case and they had no objections to the proposed	
	relocation of the remains. In the circumstance in which no one had	
	been identified as the next of kin the Local Municipality and Ward	
	Councillors would also write to the Heritage Authority confirming	
	the same.	
	Dr Matenga said the onus was on the Ward Councillors and any	
	other local civic bodies with interest on the matter to advise the	
	public in their areas of jurisdiction or operation. Mr Matshaya who has considerable experience working with the local communities	
	emphasised the point that this was the beginning of the public	
	participation and the role of the local leadership was crucial. The	
	public participation process would run from 30 days effective from	
	the date of the publication of a public notice in a local newspaper.	
5	RESPONSES	
	One of the issues of concern was the possibility that a claim	
	affiliation by kinship to the deceased is after the remains had been	
	disposed (reburied). Dr Matenga said that any such retrospective	
	claims would go through a rigorous screening process using	
	transparent scientific methods. If the claim would be validated then	

	the documentation will be revised and all the relevant authorities including SAPS and SAHRA advised accordingly. Members of KAUF arrived after the meeting had started. They complained that they were not being informed about the matter. They wanted the bones to be returned. Mr Matshaya reminded the KAUF members that they had been invited to the meeting. This meeting marked the start of the public participation. There was no intention whatsoever to exclude anyone from the process. Dr Matenga assured them that the bones had been taken to the university of Pretoria for safe storage as required in terms of SAHRA regulations.	
7	CONCLUSIONS The meeting resolved that it was important that all interested and affected parties worked together in mutual cooperation. The meeting ended and 11 30 hrs.
